Instead, they see our parties dominated by angry people, driven by ideology and identity politics, rather than what's best for our country.

That's why so many Americans are joining No Labels.

We are a movement of Democrats, Republicans and independents working to bring our leaders together to solve America's biggest problems. And we have created a home for the growing legions of Americans who feel politically homeless. We aren't a third party, but we are creating a powerful force capable of countering the influence of the extremes on both sides.

In Washington, No Labels created the bipartisan House Problem Solvers Caucus and a group of Senate allies that together led passage of landmark bipartisan legislation, including a major COVID relief bill and the 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, which represented the biggest federal public works bill since the creation of the Interstate Highway System in the 1950s.

At a moment when so many forces in American politics are tearing us apart, No Labels is working to bring Americans together by putting forth commonsense ideas and by mobilizing our members to support members of Congress with the courage to put country before party. In 2023, we released *Common Sense*, a collection of thirty political principles and policy ideas backed by the overwhelming majority of Americans. We are also working with our congressional allies to advocate for critical bills such as the recently passed foreign aid packages for Ukraine, Israel and Taiwan.

As the 2024 election season escalates, No Labels will be mobilizing our members to support the campaigns of those few brave House members – both Democratic and Republican – who are willing to govern together and with the next president.

As we carry out our work, No Labels and our community will continue to be guided by our set of foundational beliefs:

- We care about this country more than the demands of any political party.
- Political leaders need to listen more to the majority of Americans and less to extremists on the far left and right.
- We are grateful to live in a country where we can openly disagree with other people.
- America isn't perfect, but we love this country and would not want to live anywhere else.
- We can still love and respect people who do not share our political opinions.
- We support, and are grateful for, the U.S. military.
