Unspent COVID Funds

Through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act (March 2020), the Consolidated Appropriations Act (December 2020), and the American Rescue Plan Act (March 2021), Congress allocated more than \$5 trillion for coronavirus relief programs. However, nearly one-fifth of that money remains unspent. Here are some of the bigger areas with unspent funds.
